Any holder of a practising certificate granted by the Council of the Law Society of New South Wales is entitled to engage in legal practice in New South Wales as a volunteer providing pro bono legal services through a law practice or under an arrangement approved by the Council of the Law Society.

UNRESTRICTED / Principal The holder is entitled to engage in legal practice on his or her own account.

UNRESTRICTED / Non-Principal The holder is entitled to engage in legal practice as a solicitor in the course of employment by a law practice.

UNRESTRICTED / Government The holder is entitled to engage in legal practice as a solicitor in the course of employment by the New South Wales or Commonwealth government or a prescribed corporation.

**UNRESTRICTED / Corporate &
Non Lawyer Entity** The holder is entitled to engage in legal practice as a solicitor in the course of employment by a corporation (other than an incorporated legal practice) or a non-lawyer entity.

RESTRICTED / Principal The holder is entitled to engage in supervised legal practice as a partner of a law firm.

1. Mandatory Continuing Legal Education

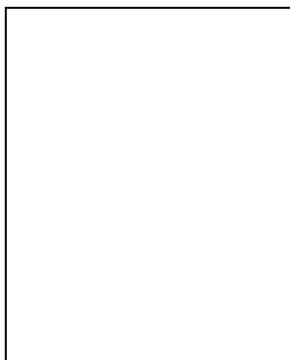
