### **GUIDELINES FOR GOVERNMENT AND CORPORATE LAWYERS** CLAIMING AN EXEMPTION FROM SUPERVISED LEGAL PRACTICE UNDER UNIFORM LAW TRANSITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS



## THIS IS AN APPLICATION TO CLAIM AN EXEMPT PERIOD OF PRACTICE TOWARDS SATISFACTION OF THE STATUTORY PERIOD OF SUPERVISED LEGAL PRACTICE AND FOR THE REMOVAL OF CONDITION 2 (THE STATUTORY CONDITION TO ENGAGE IN SUPERVISED LEGAL PRACTICE) FROM AN AUSTRALIAN PRACTISING CERTIFICATE UNDER CLAUSE 22 OF THE LEGAL PROFESSION UNIFORM LAW APPLICATION REGULATION 2015 [NSW].

Applications for practising certificates in New South Wales are made in accordance with *legal profession legislation* (as defined in the *Legal Profession Uniform Law Application Act 2014*).

#### CAN YOU CLAIM AN EXEMPTION?

#### Background

Section 49(1) of the *Legal Profession Uniform Law (NSW)* provides that it is a statutory condition of an Australian practising certificate granted in New South Wales that the holder must, in New South Wales, engage in supervised legal practice only, until the holder has completed;

- (a) if the holder completed practical legal training principally under the supervision of an Australian lawyer to qualify for admission to the Australian legal profession-a period or periods equivalent to 18 months of supervised legal practice; or
- (b) if the holder completed other practical legal training to qualify for admission to the Australian legal profession-a period or periods equivalent to 2 years of supervised legal practice.

If you completed a practical legal training course to qualify for admission, the required period of supervised legal practice is a period or periods equivalent to 2 years supervised legal practice. If you completed a form of practical legal training to qualify for admission other than a practical legal training course (eg Articles), you are required to undertake 18 months of supervised legal practice.

## TRANSITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS WITH RESPECT TO REQUIREMENTS FOR SUPERVISED LEGAL PRACTICE

Clause 22 of the *Legal Profession Uniform Law Application Regulation 2015 [NSW]* applies to government and corporate lawyers only and provides:

- (1) For the purposes of this clause, an exempt period of practice is a period of legal practice in which a government or corporate lawyer has engaged before 1 July 2015 or while exempt under this Part from holding an Australian practising certificate (whether or not the person held an Australian practising certificate during that period).
- (2) An exempt period of practice of a person is to be subtracted from the period of supervised legal practice required by the statutory condition imposed by section 49 of the Uniform Law on an Australian practising certificate granted to the person, and that section is modified accordingly.

A practitioner may make an application to remove condition 2 from his or her practising certificate if he or she has completed an exempt period of practice which is equal to or greater than the required period of supervised legal practice set out above.

#### HOW TO MAKE YOUR APPLICATION

- (1) Complete the Statutory Declaration in these Guidelines; and
- (2) Attach a letter(s) to the Statutory Declaration from your supervisor(s)/employer(s) confirming the period/s of practice.

#### **APPLICATION PROCESS**

#### Standard applications under Clause 22

If your application satisfies the statutory criteria, your application will be considered as 'standard' and should be approved within 7 working days.

#### Non-Standard applications under Clause 22

If your application does not satisfy the statutory criteria or there are other issues affecting the application, it will be referred to the Society's Licensing Committee for consideration. Non-standard applications include, but are not limited to:

- (a) reductions in the period of supervised legal practice
- (b) consideration of periods of overseas practice
- (c) the supervisor(s)/employer(s) is not available or willing to provide confirmation
- (d) Professional Standards Department considerations.

The Licensing Committee meets on a monthly basis. You may submit a covering letter with the Statutory Declaration, if necessary, outlining the circumstances and addressing any additional material you wish the Licensing Committee to take into account when considering your application.
