What is Online Court?

Online Court is a digital service that provides an additional, flexible and timely way for users to interact with the court.

Unlike current services, Online Court removes the need and associated costs of appearing in court for general matters by allowing parties to manage their listing online.

Why use Online Court?

From a few hours in line to a few minutes online, legal practitioners can save time and money.

No need to attend in-person sittings

What can be done online?

Legal Practitioners can:

- Find cases
- Make requests
 - Adjourn for Pre-Trial Conference
 - Adjourn for Directions (Case Managed List)
 - · Adjourn for Status Conference
 - · List for Hearing
 - · Adjourn to Note Settled List
 - Other requests
- Upload documents
- Consent or counter requests
- Receive automatic email notifications
- Message the Decision Maker
- View historical cases

Who can use Online Court?

Online Court is available for any legal practitioner who has a matter in the General List.

Cut-off times:


To proceed with General matters in Online Court:

- Make a request by **2pm, three business days** prior to the in-person sitting
- Consent or counter a request by **6pm**, **three business days** prior to the in-person sitting



Manage your matters in minutes, no need for in-person General List sittings

- Access anywhere, anytime
- Manage your case as soon as its listed
- Speeds up the matter when orders are made prior to the inperson sitting
