Terms of undertaking provided by William Provis Warrick on 9 November 2020

I, William Provis Warrick, Armidale in the State of New South Wales, hereby undertake that from the date of this undertaking I will:

1. cease to be employed or paid in connection with the practice of law or to be involved in the management of a law practice in New South Wales or in any other jurisdiction in Australia.
2. not seek employment in any capacity in a law practice or allow myself to be employed in any capacity within any law practice or by any legal practitioner in New South Wales or in any other jurisdiction in Australia.
3. consent to not being a signatory to any account with an Authorised Deposit-Taking institution operated by any legal practitioner or law practice in New South Wales or in any other jurisdiction in Australia.
4. consent to the Council of the Law Society of New South Wales (Council) publishing on the Register of Disqualified Persons the terms of this undertaking.
5. consent to the Council publishing in the Law Society Journal the terms of this undertaking.
6. consent to the Council, NSW Legal Services Commissioner (Commissioner) and any of their officers and employees disclosing the terms of this undertaking to such persons or bodies as may make enquiry of them.
7. give my full cooperation and assistance to the Council and Commissioner to give effect to this undertaking.

Note 1: For the purposes of this document, an “Australian lawyer” is a person admitted to the Australian legal profession.

Note 2: A person who has been convicted of a serious offence must not seek to become a lay associate of a law practice unless the person first informs the law practice of the conviction (section 122(1) of the Legal Profession Uniform Law (NSW)).

Note 3: A law practice may not employ as a lay associate any person who any principal or other legal practitioner associate of the law practice knows has been convicted of a serious offence unless the person is approved as a lay associate under section 121(2) of the Legal Profession Uniform Law (NSW) (section 121(1) of the Legal Profession Uniform Law (NSW)).
