She is Deputy Dean (Education) of the Faculty and Co-Director of the Private Law Research and Policy Group UNSW. She is the author/editor of some 26 books including Fleming's Law of Torts, (10th ed, 2011); Succession: families, property and death, 5th ed, 2017; Unexpected Consequences of Compensation Law (Hart Publishing, 2020) and The Aboriginal Wills Handbook: making culturally appropriate wills for Aboriginal People (3rd ed, 2020) and numerous articles and chapters on these subjects.
