Updated list of authorised workers who can travel outside Fairfield, Canterbury Bankstown and Liverpool LGAs for work

The list of “authorised workers” who live in the Fairfield, Canterbury Bankstown and Liverpool Local Government Areas (LGAs) has been changed from only emergency and health workers to a wide range of roles defined under the latest Public Health (COVID-19 Temporary Movement and Gathering Restrictions) Order 2021.

There is now a published list of categories of workers authorised to travel outside of the Fairfield, Canterbury-Bankstown and Liverpool LGAs if they reside in one of those areas.

The list is available [here](#). Items in this list described as “activities” mean that workers involved in services for providing that activity are allowed to leave the LGA they live in, if required for work.

This includes workers in the Public Administration and Safety Sector, who work in the administration of justice, including in relation to the operation of courts and tribunals, correctional centres and community corrections, and cannot work from home. This could include to appear in a court or tribunal, if required, and this work cannot be done remotely.

Additionally, if you live in or are staying in the [Fairfield LGA](#) but you work outside this area, you must have a COVID-19 test once every 72 hours (3 days) in order to be allowed to go to work as an authorised worker. You can go to a [COVID-19 testing clinic](#) near your home or work.
