District Court Criminal Practice Note 22

Vacated Trials due to COVID-19

Due to the large number of criminal trials being vacated because of COVID-19, it is essential when jury trials resume that they proceed as efficiently as possible.

Accordingly, when a trial is to be vacated, the trial will not be allocated a new hearing date until all pre-trial issues are argued and determined.

The date allocated for the trial will be utilised for the hearing of pre-trial argument.

Where the parties consider there are no pre-trial issues, the Court will require signed statements in the form annexed from solicitors instructing counsel who are briefed to appear in the trial, which is to be vacated.

This Practice Note commences on 30 August 2021.
