Juliet worked as an associate to the President of the former Administrative Decisions Tribunal, then as a senior principal lawyer at a Queensland government department, and a solicitor at a top tier commercial law firm in Brisbane, before becoming a senior solicitor at the NSW Crown Solicitor's Office.

Current practice

Juliet appears regularly in the Supreme and Federal Courts across a range of practice areas, including administrative law, commercial law, family provision, and high risk offender matters. She also appears in courts in other States, including Victoria and Western Australia. Juliet has extensive experience in relation to judicial and merits review matters and commercial and contractual disputes. She is particularly skilled at statutory interpretation. Having worked at the Crown Solicitor's Office and for a government department, she has an excellent understanding of issues affecting government agencies.

In addition to her work at the Bar, Juliet is a Senior Member of the NSW Civil and Administrative Tribunal, assigned to the Appeal Panel and the Administrative and Equal Opportunity Division.

Juliet regularly gives papers on topics including procedural fairness, grounds of judicial review and family provision. She has also published widely, most recently as co-author with Mark Robinson SC of the second edition of NCAT: Practice and Procedure.
