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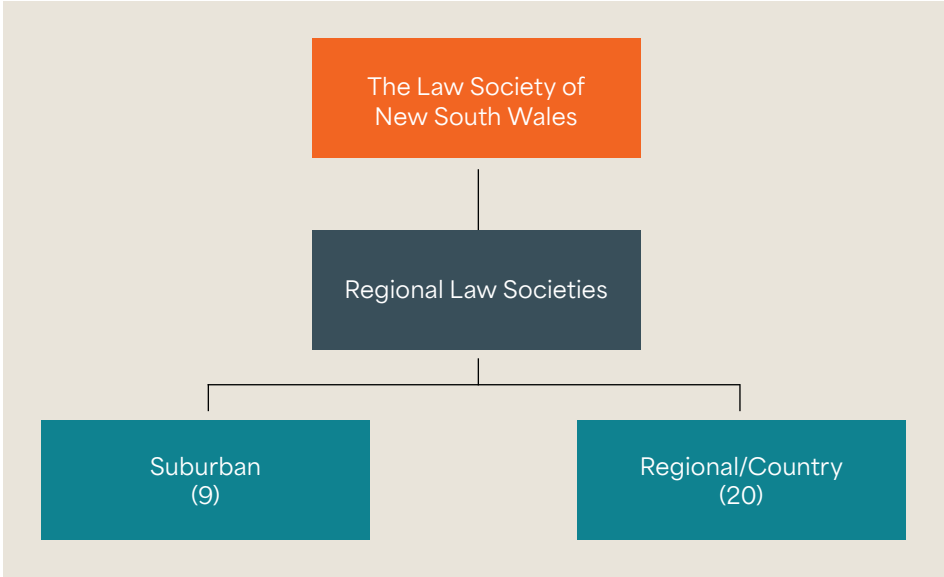
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Regional Law Societies

NSW Young Lawyers has several sub-committees, each dedicated to a substantive area of law.

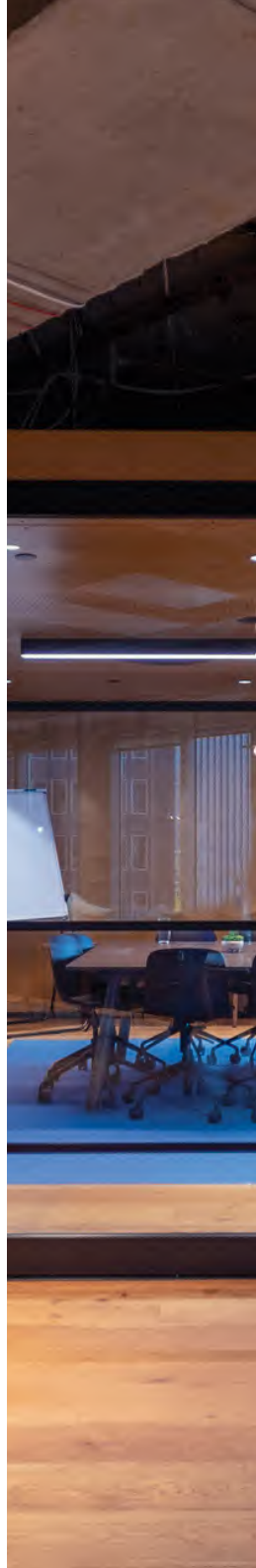
Subscribing to a sub-committee is a great way to get involved and meet other early career lawyers.

Solicitor Wellbeing Service

The Solicitor Wellbeing Service (SoWell) is a confidential psychological support service for NSW solicitors. SoWell is funded by the Law Society but is operated entirely by an independent third-party provider, and solicitors' use of this service is not identified or reported to the Law Society, to solicitors' employers, or to any other party. SoWell provides solicitors with access to:

- Three free sessions with a registered psychologist each financial year;
- Individual therapy, couples counselling, and general wellbeing checks; and
- Unlimited 24/7 telephone crisis counselling with a registered psychologist.

Mentoring program

Mental Health First Aid for legal professionals

Mental Health First Aid is recognised as an award-winning program and is included in SAMHSA's National Registry of Evidence-Based Programs and Practices. Over this one-to-two-day course, participants will learn and develop the practical skills to support someone experiencing mental health challenges and safe, best-practice next steps mental health care within the context of the Australian legal profession. Leadership Development Program

The Law Society's Leadership Development Program supports the advancement of leadership competencies specific to solicitor responsibilities and provides participants with a supported environment in which to practise and apply these skills. Leadership is explored comprehensively, including modules on leading yourself, leading others individually and in small teams, and leading in the broader organisational and political context. The program is run separately for in-house, government, and private practice solicitors, and each program is conducted over three sequential half-day, in-person workshops held across two-to-three months. Beaches of the Sapphire Coast

Bermagui Blue Pool

Tips from other early career lawyers

Q What is the one thing you wished you had known before moving to the region?

- A**
- The NSW South Coast is notorious for paralysis ticks! Make sure you inform yourself about prevention and treatment for you and your pets.
 - There is no such thing as inclement weather - only inadequate clothing!

Q What is the best kept local secret?

- A**
- Bayside Meats & Deli on Perry for the best charcuterie boards, platters, and cheese!
 - Our beaches! Most people prefer Broulee Beach, but my favourites are Murramurang and McKenzies Beach!
 - Our endangered birds like little terns, pied oystercatchers, and hooded plovers, who nest on our beaches during the warmer months.

Q Who do you trust to clean your suit?

- A**
- Dry Cleaning and Self-Service Laundromat do collections and returns from a store called Stitches.
 - Stitches, 5 Clyde St Batemans Bay (from there your items are sent to Ulladulla Dry Cleaning, so allow five business days). This is the only dry-cleaning service in Batemans Bay, Mogo, Moruya, Bodalla, Tuross, Narooma, and Cobargo areas.

Q Where is the best place for a meal?

- A**
- Food Mantra by Wildfire.
 - Mossy Point Café, also known as 'Mossy on Pacific'.
 - Narooma Bridge Seafoods.
 - Sawatdee Thai Restaurant for the best Thai Food.
 - The Broulee Brewhouse.
 - Trappers Steak & Seafood Restaurant in the Sunseeker Motor Inn.



Q What is your advice for early career lawyers who have recently moved?

- A**
- Ask for help when you need it - there is an enormous amount of collegiate goodwill in the profession, so make use of it.
 - Everyone knows everyone be mindful of these connections, for better or worse. Always be conscious of your professional responsibilities, privacy, reputation, and wellbeing.
 - Find fun little events like trivia once a week to keep yourself entertained after work. There are a lot of little hidden gems you can find simply by exploring the area. And, make friends with other young lawyers in the area, these connections can make all the difference in a new place!
 - Stay warm in winter!

Q Where is the best place for after-work drinks?

- A**
- For after-work drinks, head to The Quarterdeck for a relaxed daytime vibe with beautiful coastal views. In the evening, Breakwall Brewing Co is a great spot to unwind with locally brewed beers and a lively atmosphere.

Q Where is a great coffee place?

- A**
- 100 percent Little Wren on Orient Street, Batemans Bay. I get three coffees there a day.
 - The Local in Dalmeny.
 - The Lott Café Cooma.
 - Kattalina's on the Marina in Narooma.
 - The Tourist Café Cooma.
 - Toast Café, Pambula.

Q What exciting road trips would you recommend in your region?

- A**
- A road trip from Batemans Bay to Eden with lots of little stops in every town in between.
 - A fantastic road trip is along the Sapphire Coast to Tathra. The drive offers ocean views, rolling hills, and charming coastal towns. Tathra's historic wharf, beaches, and local food spots make it a perfect day or weekend escape.
 - There are some amazing 4WD tracks between here and the Coast that are well worth the effort.
